- using a range of activities and through its affiliates, in order to guarantee and provide the same standard of education and information throughout Europe on postreproductive health in both genders.

- preferably have previous experience as board members in a national, European, or international medical society

Board Member Requirements

EMAS board members:

- are members of EMAS in good standing at the time of their nomination, election, and throughout their term
- serve a three-year term of office (2012-2015) and may be elected for a second term
- attend EMAS board meetings which usually take place twice a year
- work with EMAS secretariat and EMAS board in identifying sponsorship opportunities for the society and its activities
- represent and promote the society and congress whenever possible in international, regional, or national meetings.

Board Elections Procedure

The EMAS Board will be elected by 2012 EMAS members via online voting in February 2012. The board will officially be instated at the EMAS General Assembly in Athens, Greece, March
